New Features:


When searching the type of creditor, multiple creditor types may be selected by holding the control key. This allows the user to limit a creditor search to certain creditor types (e.g. Administrative and 20 Largest Unsecured Creditors). You may also leave the creditor type blank and the search will return all creditors, regardless of the type.

If creditors are returned from the search, the user can expand the pull-down list. Holding the cursor over a creditor's name will list the numbers of the claims that have been filed for that creditor. If no claims have been filed by that creditor, that will be indicated as well. After selecting the creditor, a pop-up window will appear with the same information. This allows user to verify the creditor's name and address.



If the claim is no longer owned by that creditor, the claim number appears in parentheses.

The following screen allows user to enter the amount of claim. The “Amount Allowed” section no longer appears on this screen.
