## **Instructions for Supplement to Official Form 103B, Application to Have the Chapter 7 Filing Fee Waived (“Supplement”)**

1. The Supplement must be submitted along with Official Form 103B.
2. The Supplement is required with all applications to have the Chapter 7 filing fee waived filed at case opening.

4. The Supplement is not required when seeking waiver of a fee in connection with a motion to reopen a case. In Buffalo only, when a waiver of fee is requested, Official Form 103B is still required.
